was a closely guarded secret at the mill. The dye was obtained from the root of the madder plant. The colour was best achieved in large tin cauldrons, which are still in use today during dyeing days.

### Wool flocks whirl through the air ...

In the spinning machine, 280 spindles rotate. In the looms, the shuttles fly back and forth.

In the historic buildings of the Bramsche Clothmakers' Guild, founded in the 16th century, we make fleecy wool blankets on machines that are more than 100 years old. Immerse yourself in the history of wool processing and the Bramsche clothmakers' families.

### Cloth ...

is a specially processed wool fabric. We show the numerous steps and the machinery used in its production: from washing, dyeing and combing the wool to spinning the yarn to weaving, milling and refining the cloth.

### Up close ...

to history: The textile industry was the engine of industrialisation. Fast shuttles and the spinning jenny revolutionised the world of work. We show the most important stages of the development from artisanal to industrial textile production.

### The grain mill ...

is the oldest building of the Clothmakers' Guild. Once grain was ground here and later it became the cloth mill. Today it offers a unique setting for our special exhibitions, concerts, readings and other cultural events. The building can also be hired for conferences.

### Guided tours, workshops & children's birthdays ...

can be individually booked. Participation in our public tours is possible without booking ahead. For schools and kindergartens, we offer active-learning guided tours and workshops on various topics. Special offers for people with special needs as well as exciting children's birthday parties complete our program. We are happy to arrange guided tours through Bramsche and the Malgarten monastery.

### Welcome to Bramsche ...

The tourist information bureau of Stadtmarketing GmbH welcomes you in the foyer of the museum. There we can advise you on tourist attractions, gastronomy and overnight accommodation, as well as on cycling and hiking trails. In the museum shop, locally made merino wool blankets are exclusively offered. In addition, there is a large selection of items to do with sheep and wool as well as souvenirs of the city of Bramsche. The café and restaurant „Dat Wüllker Hus“ with its outdoor terrace is located next to the mill pond.
